In August 2013, Kerwood Wind, Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of NextEra Energy Canada, ULC (NextEra), obtained approval from the Ministry of the Environment (MOE) to build a Wind Energy Centre in the Municipalities of Adelaide-Metcalfe and North Middlesex, Middlesex County, Ontario.

We have established a Community Liaison Committee (CLC)

Good planning involves the community so we have established a CLC to discuss key aspects of construction, installation, operation, maintenance and retirement of the Adelaide Wind Energy Centre. This Committee is a requirement of our Renewable Energy Approval, and serves as a forum to exchange ideas, share information and to provide project updates. The CLC is not intended to revisit matters already addressed through the MOE approval process.

About the Adelaide Wind Energy Centre

The Adelaide Wind Energy Centre, which includes a transmission line that extends into the Municipality of North Middlesex, will have a maximum generating capacity of up to 60 megawatts, using 37 wind turbines (although 38 were permitted); this is enough clean energy to power over 15,000 homes. The wind farm is expected to create about 150 construction jobs, 6 to 8 full-time local operations jobs, and is estimated – over its 20 year lifespan – to contribute almost \$14 million to local governments in property taxes and \$17 million in lease payments to landowners.

About the Community Liaison Committee

The Committee is intended to be made up of people with diverse perspectives and varied backgrounds and experiences, so as to provide a broad and balanced

perspective. Representatives of the following groups were invited to make up the Committee: persons residing or owning lands within 1 km of the Project; other area residents and landowners; members of the agricultural and business community; government agencies; local organizations; special interest groups; and Aboriginal, First Nation and Métis communities. A total of four (4) CLC meetings will be facilitated by AECOM over the next two years. While
