Community Liaison Committee (CLC) Interested Member Application Form

In January 2014, East Durham Wind, Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of NextEra Energy Canada, ULC (NextEra), obtained approval from the Ministry of the Environment (MOE) to build a Wind Energy Centre in the Municipality of West Grey, Grey County, Ontario.

As part of the requirements of our Renewable Energy Approval (REA), we are establishing a Community Liaison Committee (CLC) to discuss concerns, exchange ideas, share plans and to provide project updates. Issues or concerns already addressed through the MOE's approval process will not be re-visited.

To ensure that the CLC is effective and embodies the wide range of community interests, the CLC is intended to consist of up to 14 citizens representing; persons residing or owning lands within 1 km of the Facility, other area residents and landowners, members of the agricultural and business community, government agencies, local organizations, special interest groups, and Aboriginal, First Nation and Métis communities. The CLC is expected to meet at least four times over a two year period, with two meetings each year. The meetings will be held at a time and location that is convenient to most members. We expect to hold our first meeting by the end of July 2014. An independent, third-party facilitator from AECOM has been retained to chair the Community Liaison meetings.

We will consider the following when confirming the CLC membership:

- Knowledge of the community and the issues / concerns / benefits related to wind energy;
- Leadership in / or commitment to the community;
- Ability to effectively address issues and concerns from a variety of perspectives;
- Ability to respectfully participate in community related and consensus-based discussions;
- Interest in working productively to enable two-way communication between NextEra and the community; and
- Ability to work well in a team or on a committee.

Note: Members of the CLC will be chosen by us in our sole and exclusive discretion. For those who express interest but do not become a part of the CLC, all meetings will be open so that the public can attend and observe the conversation. Requests for delegations are also welcomed and can be made prior to each meeting
