Community Liaison Committee (CLC) Interested Member Application Form

On July 24th, 2014, Goshen Wind, LP, a wholly-owned subsidiary of NextEra Energy Canada, LP (f/k/a NextEra Energy Canada, ULC) (NextEra), obtained approval from the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change (MOECC) to build a wind energy centre in the Municipalities of Bluewater and South Huron in Huron County, Ontario.

While this Committee is a requirement of our Renewable Energy Approval, we are establishing a CLC as it is also a vital part of our continued commitment to communicate and provide a forum to exchange ideas, share information and to offer project updates. Issues or concerns already addressed through the MOECC's approval process will not be re-visited.

The Committee will consist of up to 14 people with membership drawn from a cross-section of the community so as to provide a broad and balanced perspective. Representatives of the following groups are intended to make up the Committee: persons residing or owning lands in and around the project area, members of the agricultural and business community, government agencies, local organizations, special interest groups, and First Nation and Métis communities. The CLC is expected to meet four times over a two year period and the meetings will be held at a time and location that is convenient to most members, we expect to hold our first meeting in November, 2014. An independent, third-party facilitator from AECOM has been retained to chair the Community Liaison meetings.

We will consider the following when confirming the CLC membership:

- Knowledge of the community and the issues / concerns / benefits related to wind energy;
- Leadership in / or commitment to the community;
- Ability to effectively address issues and concerns from a variety of perspectives;
- Ability to respectfully participate in consensus-based discussions;
- Interest in working productively to enable two-way communication between NextEra and the community; and
- Ability to work well in a team or on a committee.

Note: Members of the CLC will be chosen by us in our sole and exclusive discretion. For those who express interest but do not become a part of the CLC, all meetings will be open so that the public can attend and observe the conversation. Requests for delegations are also welcomed and can be made prior to each meeting
