

AMENDMENT TO RENEWABLE ENERGY APPROVAL

You are hereby notified that I have amended Approval No. 0558-9GUJ8T issued on July 24, 2014 for a Class 4 wind facility, as follows:

The definition of "Application" is deleted and replaced with the following: A.

"Application" means the application for a Renewable Energy Approval dated January 15, 2013, 10. and signed by F. Allen Wiley, Goshen Wind, Inc., and all supporting documentation submitted with the application, including amended documentation submitted up to the date this Approval is issued, and as assigned by Goshen Wind, Inc. to Goshen Wind, LP on June 27, 2014; and as further amended by the application for an amendment to a Renewable Energy Approval dated April 26, 2017, and signed by Andrew Kushner, Vice President, Business Management, Goshen Wind, LP, and all supporting documentation submitted with the application, including amended documentation submitted up to June 8, 2017;

The definition of "Bat Deterrence Study Report" is added to the Approval as definition #39: B.

"Bat Deterrence Study Report" means the document titled "Re: Request for Amendment to REA 39. Number 0558-9GUJ8T for Installation of Acoustic Bat Deterrent Devices", dated April 25, 2017, signed by Derek Dudek, Goshen Wind, LP, including its appendices;

C. Conditions U1, U2, and U3 are added to the Approval as follows:

U – BAT DETERRENCE STUDY

- U1. The acoustic bat deterrent devices described in the Bat Deterrence Study Report shall be installed at turbines 19, 20, 32, 33, 38, 59, 62, 64, and 77. The acoustic bat deterrent devices may be installed at turbine 60 in lieu of one of the aforementioned turbines.
- U2. The Company shall undertake all monitoring, data collection, and reporting proposed in the Bat Deterrence Study Report. The Company shall create written records of all monitoring and data collected pursuant to this condition. The Company shall retain these records for the life of the Facility, and shall make them available for inspection by the Ministry, upon request. The Company shall share all monitoring and reporting data with the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry in accordance with the terms of a data sharing agreement between the Company and the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry.
- U3. The Company shall not commence operation of the acoustic bat deterrent devices described in Condition U1 before July 1, 2017 (except for testing purposes), and shall cease operation of the acoustic bat deterrent devices before November 1, 2017. The Company may recommence operation of the acoustic bat deterrent devices described in Condition U1 for additional time durations agreed to between the Director, the Company, and the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry, upon receiving written approval from the Director to do so.

This Notice shall constitute part of the approval issued under Approval No. 0558-9GUJ8T dated July 24, 2014.

In accordance with Section 139 of the <u>Environmental Protection Act</u>, within 15 days after the service of this notice, you may by further written notice served upon the Director, the Environmental Review Tribunal and the Environmental Commissioner, require a hearing by the Tribunal.

In accordance with Section 47 of the <u>Environmental Bill of Rights</u>, 1993, the Environmental Commissioner will place notice of your request for a hearing on the Environmental Registry.

Section 142 of the Environmental Protection Act provides that the notice requiring the hearing shall state:

- a. The portions of the renewable energy approval or each term or condition in the renewable energy approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- b. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to <u>each</u> portion appealed.

The signed and dated notice requiring the hearing should also include:

- 1. The name of the appellant;
- 2. The address of the appellant;
- 3. The renewable energy approval number;
- 4. The date of the renewable energy approval;
- 5. The name of the Director;

6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in;
